Vestry Report

The Vestry is working on ways to streamline meetings in an effort to work most efficiently in a shorter period of time. We would like to keep meetings to no longer than 90 minutes, and less if possible. Committee reports will be submitted electronically before the meeting, reviewed at home, and questions can be brought to the meeting. Agenda items that are of most importance, as well as those requiring a vote, will be addressed first, leaving items of lesser concern free to be tabled if necessary, and also allowing Vestry members the option to leave if they have to.

It has come to our attention that one of our parishioners was quite ill recently, without our knowledge. It is our greatest hope that if you are ill, you let the rector, office or wardens know, or have someone contact one of them on your behalf. We hate to think of anyone in a time of need that isn't being cared for or thought about. As Rev. Wanda has said in the past, "Better to receive news twice than not at all".

We have had issues recently with vagrants occupying the cloister area of our church and leaving behind messes to be cleaned. The police have been notified, and if you are around the building and see activity that is not normal or of a concern, please report it to the wardens, or police should that be necessary.

World Communion Sunday will take place October 1 at 10 AM at North Presbyterian Church. Plans for that are underway, and will continue through the summer months. Please plan to attend this special service on Oct. $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ and show your community and church support.


A new building use form is nearing the final stages. More information will be available on that next month.

Trinity History

The Rev. Henry E. Hubbard, Rector of Trinity Church June 1, 1917 – July 1,1953

In his autobiography, *Light and Shadows of a Long Ministry*, the Rev. Henry E. Hubbard told of his call to Trinity, which occurred one hundred years ago:

"I spent nearly 14 years, perhaps in some ways the happiest of my ministry at St. Paul's (Episcopal Church in Waterloo) and had little thought of leaving, till one Sunday in March 1917, a distinguished looking man was in our congregation and after service asked for an interview with me. The stranger proved to be H. Adelbert Hamilton, Ph.D. the Vice President of Elmira College and member of the Vestry at Trinity Church. He presented the need for someone to take up the work of the parish and begged me to make the trip to Elmira and look over the field, which I did, with the result that I resigned at St. Paul's to go to Trinity Church, Elmira on June 1, 1917."

Fun facts about our church's history

Fr. Hubbard closed his autobiography with the following:

"On having rounded out 58 years in an active ministry and (sic) Trinity Church Elmira, having been built up to a place where younger hands should take over, I resigned on July 1, 1953 and turned my face to Waterloo where I spent 14 years, and where I had many friends who, when I was Rector, were my children.... Mrs. Hubbard and I are finding much happiness in our new home."
